- Create, develop and strengthen training & research facilities for the personnel engaged and to be engaged in rehabilitation and service of persons with disabilities.
- Exchange ideas and experiences regarding new techniques with various national and international agencies, organizations, or individual interested in teaching and research of disabled person.
- Undertake academic, extension and training programs for empowerment of disabled persons.
- Promote disabled persons spiritually, socially and economically by providing suitable education and bring them to the main stream.
- Explore suitable placement for the educated disabled graduates in public as well as private sector enterprises.
- Monitor the implementation of all existing and future legislation and policies pertaining to higher education of person with disabilities.
- Perform such other tasks as the University may from time to time determine, keeping in view the objectives of the University.
- Sanskrit & basic knowledge of Computer is compulsory in the University curriculum for Undergraduate & Postgraduate students as well. University believes that Sanskrit is Mother of all languages and one cannot understand Indian culture without knowing it. Sanskrit is the key to unfold the mystery of nature and great Indian Heritage and culture similarly; the knowledge of Computer is necessary to cope with modern challenges.

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

University emphasised not only child –centred, society-centred, Knowledge-centred , eclectic, but also adopt the principle of constructivism **in which** everything that goes on within the University , including extra-class activities, guidance, and interpersonal relationships .Everything that is planned by the University personnel. A series of experiences undergone by learners in the University. Being the University for the Disabled only, University prepared curriculum that is eventually meant for the disabled only.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

University is facilitating all the need based resources for creating the teaching and learning environment focussing on the needs of the disability and the quality parameters. Faculty members are nurturing new teaching strategies as per the individual and group learning environment. Collaborative and co-operative methods of teaching is the unique feature of teaching learning process.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Regarding the quality improvement strategies about the examination and evaluation, University adopted the semester system by replacing the traditional annual system in the most of the programmes. System of evaluation has been improved by adpting centralised evaluation system and transparent mechanism in terms of appointing experts in examination.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Research environment created by the University for the quality improvement in the context of research culture. The thrust areas of research in this University are disability, manpower planning, bundelkhand, rehabilitation, latest topics on education and other related topics relevant to the disability. University motivates students as well as the faculty members to be associated with the research.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

University moving towards digitisation and automation of the Library. Necessary steps have already been discussed and is ready for the implementation. Smart class room has already been the footprint of smart teaching learning process, the disabled students need the technology by which their understanding on the subject matter to be re-oriented on the basic fundamentals of teaching learning where ICT is root cause of all round development of the child. Physical infrastructure has already been improved and is given appropriate mechanisms for the total development of the University.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Human resource management (HRM) is a function in organizations designed to maximize employee performance in service of an employer's strategic objectives. It is primarily concerned with the management of people within organizations, focusing on policies and on systems. In this University registrar office handles the works and responsibility of Human Resource Management including employee benefits design employee recruitment, "training and development", performance appraisal, etc.
